## April 1, 2018 – John 20:1-31 – "Sent by the Risen King"

## **QUESTIONS**

(potential discussion/conversation questions to use in your GGs this week)

- 1. Ice Breaker: When was a time when you received some unexpected good news? How did you react?
- 2. Modern skepticism leads many to doubt the truthfulness of the resurrection. What are some of the reasons skeptics give? How does John present a trustworthy account of Jesus' resurrection?
- 3. Mary Magdalene shows us that anyone can be an evangelist (women were marginalized, and she had been demon-possessed). Do you sometimes think you aren't capable of faithfully evangelizing? Why?
- 4. Jesus' resurrection shows that he brings new life, not advice for self-improvement or any other man-made religion? What false ideas can we sometimes believe about what Christianity is "about"? How do these ideas ignore or downplay the resurrection?
- 5. Tony mentioned that Jesus offers us a new family? Why is this an important part of the gospel message? What are some practical ways we can live out this reality as a church? As a GG?
- 6. Jesus calls his disciples to live like he did—as a missionary in the world. What is one specific way you can live as a missionary?
- 7. Are there specific people in your life we can be praying for as a GG that you would like to see come to know Christ?
- 8. What is the Holy Spirit's role(s) in evangelism?
- 9. Tony talked about several reasons why people (like Thomas) might doubt the truth of the gospel. [Some doubt...
- (1) is grounded in one's moral preferences and desires;
- (2) stems from a thousand of small choices over time;
- (3) is triggered by confrontation with others;
- (4) is the result of ignorance;
- (5) is the result of massive religious disappointment]

Which of these can you most identify with? How have you responded to any doubts you have had? How does Thomas respond?
