Sermon Discussion

Preschool

- 1. What does it mean to be a citizen of heaven?
- 2. What are some sins or temptations you face?
- 3. How can Jesus help you to fight sin in your life?

Younger Kids

- 1. What does it mean to be a citizen of heaven?
- 2. What are some "human desires" that could keep you from living for God?
- 3. What are some practical ways that we can arm ourselves to think more like Christ?
- 4. Why do you think we still struggle with sin even after giving our lives to Christ? Older Kids
- 1. How are your values, pleasures and interests different from the world's?
- 2. What are some sin struggles you have that might prevent you from living your life fully devoted to Christ?
- 3. What are some practical ways that we can arm ourselves to think more like Christ?
- 4. How is the way you respond to sin now, different then before you were a follower of Christ?

Christ Connection

How does this text point us to Jesus?

Preschool: Choosing to live for Jesus will be difficult, and we must be prepared to battle sin.

Elementary: Following the path of Jesus will involve suffering, so be ready to suffer rather than to sin.

Activity

Armor of God

Use this time to walk through the armor of God (Ephesians 6:11-18). Attached you will find two coloring pages about the armor of God. Print these out in advance.

For preschool, have your child color the picture.

For elementary, the pdf includes images to cut out. Have your child draw a picture of themselves on construction paper and then glue the cutouts to their figure.

Talk about what it means to put on the whole armor of God and how to be prepared to battle sin in their own lives.
