## **In-person Service Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)**

**Q:** What restrictions & guidelines are in place for the in-person services?

**A:** We will be following the CDC & governmental guidelines for in-person gatherings. Masks will be required while inside the building for adults & children 12 or older (unless you have an exemption). Masks are not required for outdoor services, except when physical distancing isn't possible. Physical distancing of at least 6 feet is required.

**Q:** Are bathrooms available during services?

**A:** Yes. During the outdoor service, though, the only entrance to the building that will be open is in the back-left of the building, near right field. There will be an IDC volunteer there monitoring who enters the building. There are bathrooms just inside those doors.

**Q:** Who can I sit with?

**A:** We ask that you only sit with those who are part of your household and leave 4 chairs between you and the next household (or an aisle).

**Q:** Will there be hand sanitizer available?

**A:** Yes. We have a few automatic dispensers and a few manual-pump dispensers set up throughout the building. Feel free to bring your own, though!

**Q:** Will we take the Lord's Supper together?

**A:** Yes. We will continue with the model we've been using for Members' Meetings with pre-packaged elements. There will be stations set up (for each service) with the elements available for you to grab on your way in. Our volunteers who are preparing the elements will be wearing gloves & masks while they get everything set up. We will also have a gluten-free option available.

**Q:** Will there be childcare or other kids programming?

**A:** No. Children of all ages are welcome and encouraged to attend the service with their parents.

**Q:** Should I come if I feel sick?

**A:** No. Please stay home if you think you might be sick, are exhibiting COVID-19 symptoms, have received a positive COVID-19 diagnosis recently, or have been exposed to someone with a positive diagnosis. [Reference the CDC website for more guidance.](#)
