The story in 2 Chronicles 20 quickly became a source of encouragement to our family, as well as one of our themes, at the start of the global pandemic in 2020. When King Jehoshaphat saw the armies of the Moabites, Ammonites, and Meunites set to invade Judah, he was rightly afraid. What did he do in his fear?
