## **QUESTIONS**

*(potential discussion/conversation questions to use in your GGs this week)*

1. Take a few minutes and celebrate the various ways God has shown his grace and kindness to us over the summer.
2. What are some reasons "judging" or "being judgmental" is so frowned upon in our culture?
3. How do we reconcile the reality that Jesus is the "friend of sinners" with his teaching here that he is coming to execute judgment? How does this shape the way we talk with our unbelieving friends?
4. Jesus talked about dividing families in Luke 12:52-53. When you hear these verses. What comes to mind as some of the more difficult things God has called you to "give up" in order to follow him? How has he shown himself faithful to you?
5. Luke 12:57-59 remind us that we will be held accountable before a holy God. What are some ways we can cultivate a heart that esteems God's holiness, yet doesn't live in fear of condemnation?
6. Jesus rejects the idea that those whom Pilate or the Tower in Siloam killed were directly responsible for their deaths because of their sin. How should this shape the way we come alongside those who are hurting among us?
7. The central application of this text is that we should repent in light of Jesus' just judgment. How can we develop a culture of repentance as a GG? As a church? What needs to change to get us there?
