## August 25, 2024 Genesis 14:1-24 "A Rescue Mission and a Meeting"

## **QUESTIONS**

(potential discussion/conversation questions to use in your GGs this week)

- 1. There is a lot going on in the world in Chapter 14, and one would think the story of Abram would be in the background. But it's not. Why does Abram's story make it in the Bible over the stories of the Kings of the day?
- 2. Faith and obedience to the Lord matters, even if it doesn't make the headlines. Where do you struggle to believe this?
- 3. What is admirable from the example of Abram and his rescue of Lot?
- 4. How does Abram's resume of Lot point us to what Jesus has done for us?
- 5. Genesis 14 is not the end of the story for the descendants of the Eastern Kings. In Acts 2, we read some of these descendants were present at Pentecost, and they became followers of Jesus. God has a plan to rescue people from their sin, even over a long period of time. How might this encourage us as we preach the gospel to others?
- 6. How is Jesus like Melchizedek?
- 7. Tony reminded us of a seven-fold promise of blessing from God in chapter 12. Do you remember any of those? Where are you struggling to trust in God's promises?
- 8. It would have been really easy for Abraham to have taken the loot from the king of Sodom, and try to take matters into his own hands, seeing God's promises come to fruition, but he waited. In what ways do you find yourself tempted to bring yourself to good ends through easier ways?
- 9. What does it mean that Jesus is both a King and a Priest? How do these truths affect our worship?
