March 23, 2025 Genesis 32:1-32 "Wrestling with God"

QUESTIONS

(potential discussion/conversation questions to use in your GGs this week)

- 1. Jacob calls out to God because of his fear of Esau. What does this suggest about the purpose of fears and feelings of desperation?
- What can we learn from Jacob's prayer and apply to our own prayer life? [verse 9-12: Call on the name of God, appeal to the promises of God, Acknowledge your unworthiness and God's goodness, seek specific help]
- 3. Jacob asks God to be faithful to the promise made to Abraham, even though Jacob is unworthy of it. Why does God keep his promises even when his people fail?
- 4. Jacob intercedes on behalf of his family, seeking God's protection. What does interceding for others in prayer have to do with the life of faith.
- 5. One purpose of Jacob's wrestling was to bring him to the end of his strength. Why might this be a good thing?
- 6. The Story of Jacob wrestling with God results in a new name and identity for Jacob: Israel. What does this story of struggle reveal about the nature of God? About the nature of Jacob?
- 7. What connections do you see between the first Israel (Jacob) and the ultimate and True Israel (Jesus)?
- 8. This text says a lot about drawing near to God. How are you drawing near to God? How can we encourage one another to keep drawing near to Him?
- 9. Tony said the most important meeting of your day is with God. Are there any action steps to take to keep in alignment with this idea?
