QUESTIONS

(potential discussion/conversation questions to use in your GGs this week)

- 1. Can anyone share a time of conflict that was resolved well? Or a time that wasn't resolved well?
- 2. This passage references reconciliation in conflict. Ultimately, we must reconcile to God through Christ. Take a moment to reflect on the goodness and mercy from God in how He has reconciled us to Him. How does our reconciliation to God inform our conflict resolution with people?
- 3. Jacob does not attack his brother; rather, he meets him in a posture of humility. What lessons should Christians take from this?
- 4. What are some key principles and biblical passages for handling conflict with our brothers and sisters?
- 5. Tony quoted Alfred Poirier: "Unresolved conflicts between Christians have less to do with people being skillful than with them being sinful." How does understanding that conflict is a heart issue help us?
- 6. How often do you pray when in conflict? What role should prayer play in conflict?
- 7. Esau's response to Jacob is one of reconciliation and peace. How are Christians to be peacemakers? How are they to respond to requests of forgiveness?
